As the story moves deeper in space (and Roy plunges deeper into the hidden wounds of his psyche), Pitt's exceptionally well-executed facial expressions, eye movements and mannerisms reveal fragments of instability to an almost frightening extent, given how much of a calculated, calm and disciplined person the leading character seemed to be on the outside. You can virtually see Roy's deconstruction and recontruction throughout this epic journey into the abyss (of outer space and human soul).

Questions are raised, and answers are not always easy to digest. A life devoted to achieving a "greater" professional/scientific (but not necessarily noble) goal can lead to alienation and eventually abstaining from life itself. And it's not like it's always a rewarding journey. It often just leaves behind severely traumatized souls, as Gray's depressive, introspective space drama depicts in the most touching way.

If there are any negatives to be pointed out: Perhaps a little too many references to Apocalypse Now (at least I found them a bit distracting).

p.s.: Many haters will desperately try to discredit this film. The easiest path is to rant about the screenplay and overly focus on supposed "plot holes", taking the plot at face value despite the movie's metaphorical approach. Sadly, they are missing the main themes along with every point it tries to make. It's actually very absurd, since most of the scepticists are obviously fans of Interstellar, whose ending is a plot hole the size of a... black hole! Don't let these hateful attacks distort the experience of this thrilling journey into the soul.



### Report

(1) Compare the sentiment scores between positive and negative samples AND between your own and the LIWC-based evaluations. Are there differences? To what extent do the LIWC-based sentiment analysis results correspond with human (i.e., your own) judgment? (10 points; max 50 words)

The analysis between the researcher's and the LIWC's sentiment scores are closer to each other in the first movie, compared to less close in the second movie. The AI was less forgiving with the negative content. Whereas, the scores of the human could be an affect of biases.

(2) The LIWC score is based on the frequency of "emotional" words within a given text. The list of emotional words has been predefined by the LIWC developers in the emotional word dictionary. Currently the dictionary includes 6,400 words. Suppose that you are a talented computer scientist who works at the LIWC company to improve the sentiment analysis

algorithm. In addition to the current words dictionary, what would you suggest should be enhanced, changed, or modified to develop a more accurate sentiment analysis tool? (15 points; max 100 words)

It would be difficult to change or modify the sentiment analysis tool because the AI would not understand conflicting statements such as sarcasm. It would count the sarcasm as either positive or negative because these are simply words. If the AI could "see" a person speaking sarcasm, there would be "tells" of sarcasm, such as eyes rolling, smirking, etc. It would need to be on an Entity and Aspect level, where the data is there are complicated structures of opinions. This would assist the AI in seeing the "comparison" or the different aspects that are both negative and positive.

(3) Discuss the results of the Sentiment Viz analysis. How are the movies different? What does the Sentiment Viz analysis tells you about the movie popularity over the past 24 hours? Which movie do you think is more successful RIGHT NOW, and why? And how does the 24-hour Sentiment Viz analysis compare to your LIWC analysis above? (15 points; max 100 words)

From the Sentiment Viz analysis, "The Old Guard" seems to be the more popular movie. There are more darker circling and the quantity of mentions of it are more than "Ad Astra". This could be due to the "Ad Astra" being out longer than "The Old Guard". However, "Ad Astra" was better received than "The Old Guard". There are less negative comments about it. "The Old Guard", from the analysis and LIWC, has more negativity mentioned. The data could change if the AI understood a reviewer liking the film overall, but has negative opinions about aspects of the movie.
